Cultural Shifts and Generational Values

✓ Strategies and Considerations:

- Activity: Have students debate a CSR issue from both a Boomer and Gen Z perspective.
- Activity: Create a group project proposing a sustainability initiative for a real company.

Reflection Questions:

- How do your values influence the type of companies you want to work for?
- What CSR issue feels most important to your generation and why?

Economic Trends and Labor Market Shifts

✓ Strategies and Considerations:

✓ Strategies and Considerations:

Reflection Questions:

- Activity: Host a virtual exchange session with students from another country.

Reflection Questions:

- Why is it important to understand cross-cultural communication in business?
- What global issues will most impact businesses in the next decade?

Educational Technology Industry

✓ Strategies and Considerations:

- Activity: Compare two ed-tech platforms and evaluate effectiveness.
- Activity: Students design a mock ed-tech tool for business education.
